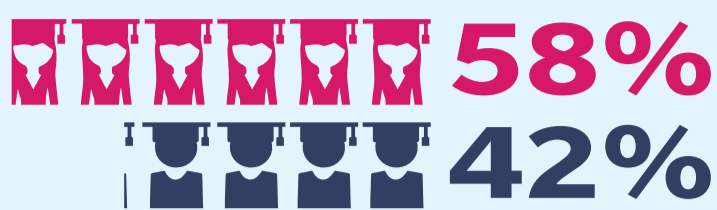


# Do You Know How Women Are Represented In The Workforce?

Women Earn More Degrees Than Men



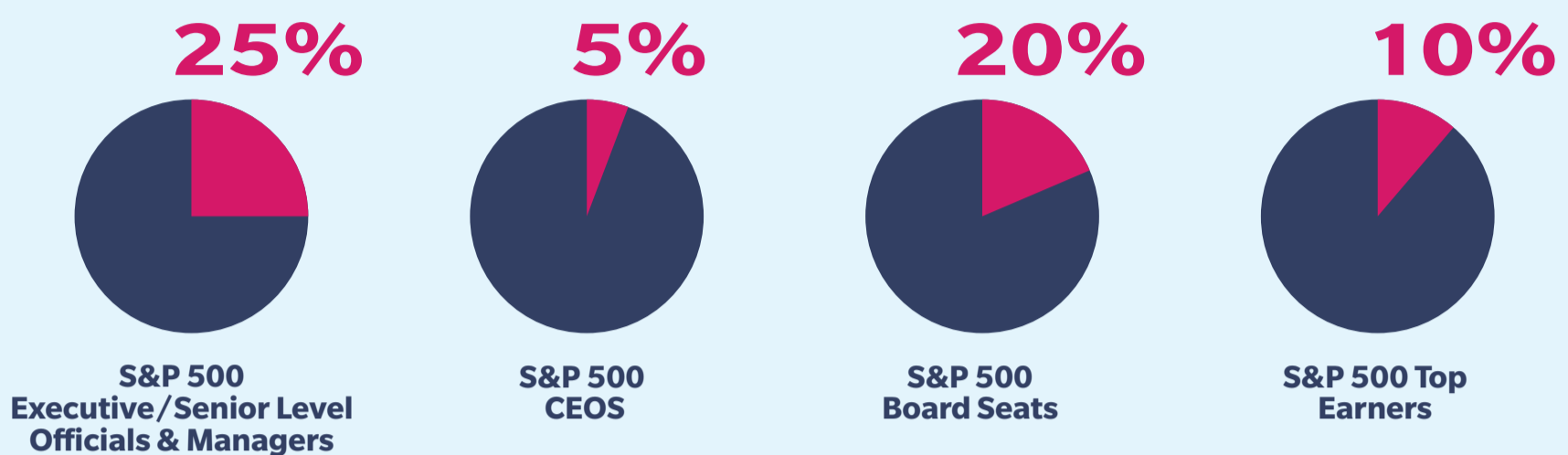

Yet They Are **Significantly** Underrepresented In Top Leadership Positions

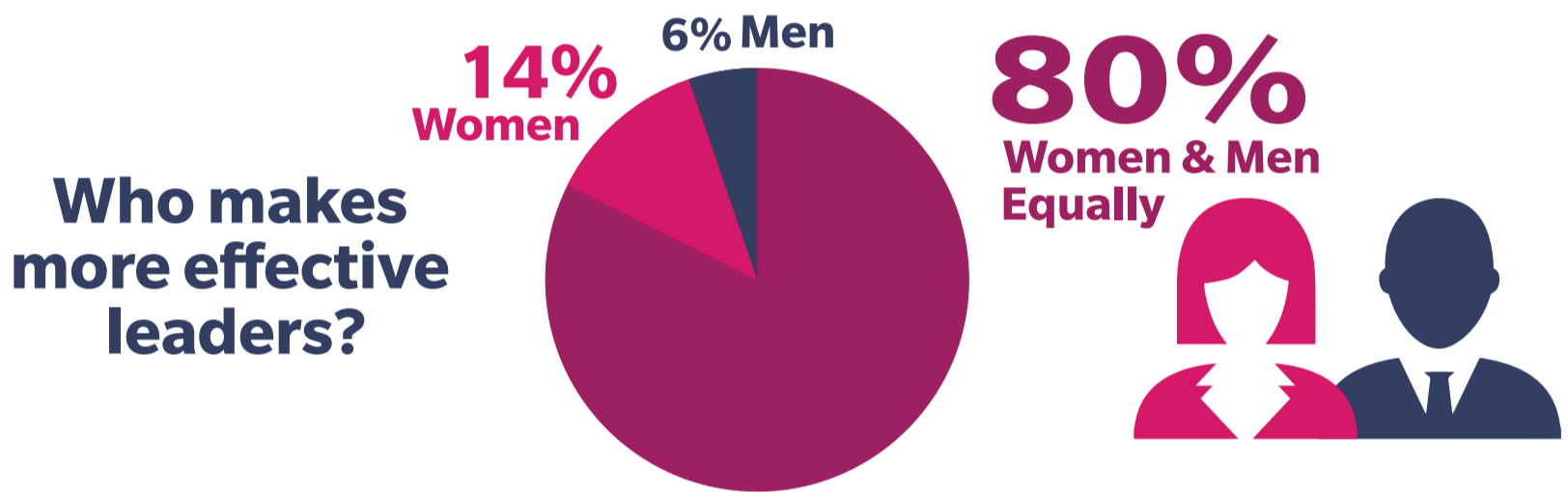

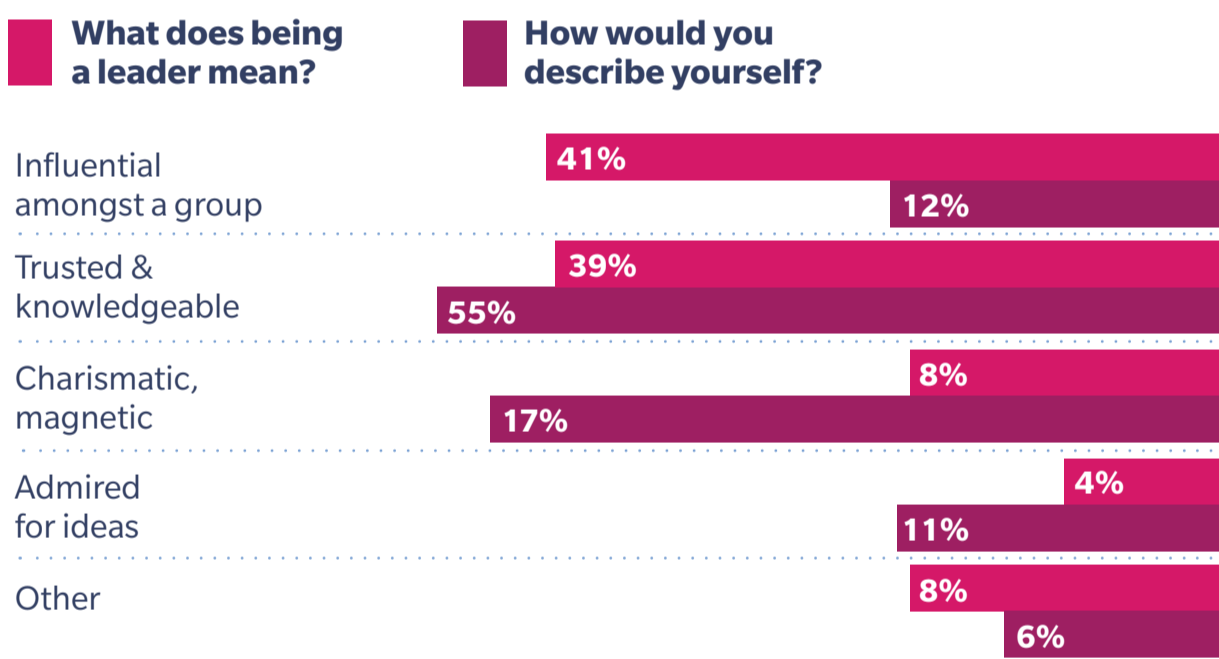
## How Do We Close Leadership's Gender Gap?

However, Demands Placed On Professional Women Are Different

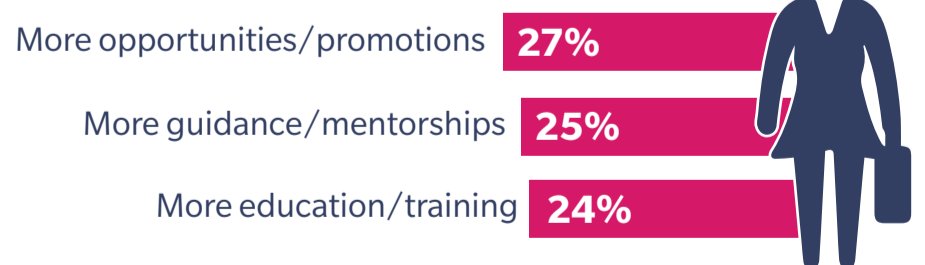
What is the largest roadblock for female leaders?
